10 Eagle Point Trails

Eagle Point is one of the most accessible paths in the Town's vast (875 acres) Punkhorn Parklands. The Town acquired the property in 1986 from the Carleton Francis family for conservation. The State paid half of the purchase cost. There are several loop trails that include bluffs overlooking Upper Mill Pond, and a view of an old cranberry bog. The path crosses the dike separating the bog from the Pond, and stretches through beautiful woods of pine, oak, and huckleberry understory. The Punkhorn Parklands play a valuable role in protecting the area from which the Town draws part of its water supply.

Round trip trail length: 1 mile Blue and Red outer loop.

Directions: From Stony Brook Road, turn on to Run Hill Road and travel 1.2 miles to where it turns to gravel. There is a public parking lot on the left. The Eagle Point trail starts on the right hand side of the road at the access point to Upper Mill Pond.
